

What is Small bore, Bull's eye / Precision Pistol Shooting?



This is a pure pistol sport, shooting at a paper target of concentric circles, Off-hand which means shooter uses one hand, unsupported. Any small bore, 22 caliber semi-automatic pistol or revolver is allowed.

CCPL League allows any Non Projecting dot, open sites or pistol scopes. Special Grips and modified triggers are allowed as long as they meet current .22cal NRA Pistol Regulations

In Standard Match Competition, a match will consist of the following:

SLOW FIRE: One String of Slow Fire, on the range Officers Command:
Shoot 10 rounds within 10 minutes at a standard 50ft. NRA B-2 Slow fire target
(Some ranges only allows 5 rounds per magazine in which case no command is needed to load and shoot your second 5 rounds)
Ten rounds total with a possible score of 100 points

TIME FIRE: Two Strings of time Fire, on the range Officers Command: Shoot two 5 round strings within 20 seconds at a standard 50ft. NRA B-3 Time fire target Ten rounds total with a possible score of 100 points

RAPID FIRE: Two Strings of Rapid Fire, on the range Officers Command: Shoot two 5 round strings within 10 seconds at a standard 50ft. NRA B-3 Rapid fire target Ten rounds total with a possible score of 100 points

At the end of the Match, the sum of your Slow, Time & Rapid scores is your Match Total Score (300 Points Possible)

Interesting Note: The NRA B-2, Slow Fire "10" ring and the NRA B-3, Time & Rapid "X" Rings are about the size of a nickel....... **That's what we call Bull's eye shooting.**
