## Classification Criteria

## Classification Rules:

- A new (Unclassified) competitor shall be classified using the average of his/her first 12 matches.
- Classified competitors will remain in that class for that CCPL season. If their season ending average exceeds the range for that class they will be re-classified upward accordingly when they begin their next season.
- Individual competitors will compete for awards within their classification.
- Returning competitors and Individuals, who have not competed for less then 3 consecutive years, shall be classified according to their highest previous CCPL average consisting of at least 12 matches.
- Individuals who do not compete for 3 consecutive years will lose their classification and return as a new unclassified shooter.
- Competitors wishing to be re-classified downward may do so once in a lifetime by petitioning the CCPL to do so before the season starts. They will remain in their current classification for that season and will be re-classified for the following season based on their ending average that consists of at least twelve matches.
- (OV) Over All Classification is a special classification created by the CCPL. It is only used for the final Awards and is a one time temporary classification. The (OV) Class is comprised of the top three End-of-Year High Masters. The top three High Masters are removed from the High Master Class and reclassified for award of excellence in the OV Classification. There for the balance of High Masters are moved up in to their new High Master award positions.
